## Mango Languages

Create an account to track progress or be able to learn on the go with an internet-capable device. Choose from all languages or select from these sections:

### Learn English

Begins with users' native language and teaches English. Includes almost 20 languages.


### Specialty Courses

Short courses with a specific focus for professional or recreational use, such as Medical Spanish and St. Patrick's Day.

### Mango Labs

Allows users to try language courses that are under development.

**Mango Languages** offers courses in 72 languages to allow users to learn, listen and speak their chosen language. Courses for English learners begin in the student's native language and teach English. Courses focus on vocabulary, grammar, pronunciation and culture.



Choose from courses in all languages, courses for English language learners or short, specialty courses. Clicking icons on the left sidebar allows access to Mango Labs and apps for e-devices.
